## FIRST ENDOWED CURATORIAL POSITION CREATED

### COLIN B. BAILEY NAMED THE PETER JAY SHARP CHIEF CURATOR

For the first time in its history, The Frick Collection has created an endowed position for a primary curatorial staff member. Colin B. Bailey will now be known as The Peter Jay Sharp Chief Curator. Last year, the Frick received a generous challenge grant of \$2,000,000 from The **Peter Jay Sharp Foundation**. With plans to raise the required matching funds over a four-year period, the institution and its Board of Trustees embarked on a successful effort that lasted a mere eight months. Comments Frick Collection Board President Margot Bogert, “We extend our deepest gratitude to The Peter Jay Sharp Foundation for providing the generous gift that initiated this important and exciting campaign. The endowment made possible by the grant will provide vital and ongoing support for our curatorial department, and we’re thrilled to acknowledge their significant commitment to the institution in this way.”

Adds Director Anne L. Poulet, “The Peter Jay Sharp Foundation has played a central role in helping our curatorial staff develop an exhibition program of the highest quality and interest, year after year. Indeed, the Frick’s critically acclaimed Memling, Tiepolo, and Stubbs exhibitions would never have happened without the Foundation’s contributions. Likewise, their endowment gift offers a self-sustaining resource that will further bolster our ability to create such valued shows and publications. I also want to acknowledge our Trustees, who share with The Peter Jay Sharp Foundation a deep commitment to the

institution's curatorial vision, and so quickly provided the matching funds themselves. Their response to this challenge grant is deeply rewarding." Among the recent projects supported by the Foundation are: *The Drawings of François Boucher* (2003); *A Beautiful and Gracious Manner: The Art of Parmigianino* (2004); *Memling's Portraits* (2005); *Domenico Tiepolo (1727—1804): A New Testament* (2006); and *George Stubbs (1724—1806): A Celebration*, currently on view.

## **ABOUT PETER JAY SHARP CHIEF CURATOR COLIN B. BAILEY**

Colin B. Bailey has been Chief Curator of The Frick Collection since October 2000. He received his doctorate from Oxford University in 1985. Since then he has held positions at The J. Paul Getty Museum in Malibu; the Philadelphia Museum of Art; the Kimbell Art Museum in Fort Worth; and the National Gallery of Canada in Ottawa, where he was Deputy Director and Chief Curator. He has authored several books and catalogues, among them: *The Loves of the Gods: Mythological Painting from Watteau to David* (Rizzoli International, 1992); *Renoir's Portraits: Impressions of an Age* (Yale University Press, 1997); *Patriotic Taste: Collecting Modern Art in Pre-Revolutionary Paris* (Yale University Press 2002), for which he won the 2004 Mitchell Prize for the best art history book for 2002 and 2003; *The Age of Watteau, Chardin and Fragonard: Masterpieces of French Eighteenth-Century Genre Painting* (National Gallery of Canada and Yale University Press, 2003); and *Renoir's Landscapes 1867–1883* (The National Gallery, 2007). He is also the author of *Building The Frick Collection: An Introduction to the House and Its Collections* (Scala, 2006), the institution's first publication focused on the famed Fifth Avenue mansion that today serves as the museum's remarkable setting.

In addition, Dr. Bailey has written numerous articles and scholarly essays, lectured at art institutions across the country, and curated exhibitions, including *Memling's Portraits* and *Jean-Étienne Liotard (1702–1789): Swiss Master* on view last summer at The Frick Collection. He is currently conducting

research and making preparations for *Gabriel de Saint-Aubin*, a collaboration with the Musée du Louvre, Paris, which opens at the Frick in October. Dr. Bailey received the Chevalier de l'Ordre des Arts et des Lettres from the French government in 1994 and is presently a trustee and secretary of the Association of Art Museum Curators.
